IN 1990, MY FAMILY HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO MOVE TO THE PHILIPPINES AS MISSIONARIES. BUT OUR PLANS FAILED, AND WE RETURNED TO THE U.S. IN 1991. YET GOD HAD BIGGER PLANS.

One of our Filipino contacts from that year continued our Bible study, building it into a church, which resulted in many more Philippine churches starting! In 2010 these churches caught the vision of going to unreached parts of Asia in partnership with U.S. sponsors. Our first attempt fell apart, but a second team of missionaries was trained and moved to Cambodia in 2017. Yet after a year, only one family remained, Fred and Jolita.



Now, despite failures, government policies, and Covid-19 restrictions, this team of three strong leaders are working together to share the gospel, train disciples, and start churches in three different locations in Cambodia!

GIVING TOWARD THE MINISTRIES OF MISSIONARIES*





THE IMPACT OF COVID-19

IN 2020, WE SAW GIVING TOWARDS THE MINISTRY OF OUR MISSIONARIES INCREASE BY 13.6%.

Reliant ministry partners had to make decisions that would drastically change the way they ministered, our missionaries were required to pivot their strategies in light of stay-at-home orders, people everywhere experienced financial uncertainty, and even our Central Staff quickly moved to serve missionaries while working remotely.

We have all experienced several ways that this year caused disruptions and even transformed life as we know it. Yet, even in the midst of all of this, we have continued to see God do unexpected and miraculous things. He is making streams in the desert. This would not be possible without donors like you giving generously to missionaries, even in these unusual circumstances. Your giving made a difference in 2020.



VIRTUAL TRAINING

Reliant's New Staff Training provides missionaries from all over the world with an in-depth and practical guide on raising support. This 5-day training is a blend of instruction on topics ranging from Making the Financial Ask to Biblical Foundations. It includes small group workshops that provide new missionaries an opportunity to construct and practice their support presentation with a trained coach.



WE WERE ALWAYS PLANNING TO LAUNCH OUR NEW CHURCH IN THE FALL OF 2020.

But when the pandemic hit, everyone kept asking us whether it was wise to move forward in planting a church or not. As we prayed, fasted, and sought wise counsel, God kept pressing upon us the truth that Jesus will build His church. And a pandemic wouldn't stop Him.

Planting Salt & Light LA during Covid-19 has certainly been challenging. But barriers are often opportunities to see how God wants to work differently than we expected. In this season of gathering in parks or online, we've forged a greater sense of family and mission. We've been able to start multiple online Bible studies with unbelievers, minister to the homeless, and give at least half of our offerings away. And maybe most importantly, being forced to start a smaller, simpler form of church has given others among us the vision to start their own. In the midst of a pandemic, God isn't just birthing one church, but potentially many.

I AM REALLY EXCITED ABOUT HOW GOD HAS TAKEN MY PERSONAL MINISTRY IN A TOTALLY NEW DIRECTION IN THE LAST YEAR!

My husband (Stephen Campbell, also serving at Fellowship Church) and I have always felt called to church planting. A little over a year ago, we were actually in the process of scouting out a potential church plant location in south Texas that ultimately didn't feel like where the Lord was leading us.

In a gathering of Collegiate churches from our region, one of the church plants sent out from ours in 2000 was sharing about the state of their church, their struggles, and the deep need for more ministry workers serving there. Long story short, the Lord really moved in our hearts in a way totally different than we were expecting and led us into a process of being mobilized to join them as that church experiences a "reboot" of their ministry and we are planning to move in January!

We are so excited about the new things the Lord is doing at Hope Fellowship Church in Denton and look forward to being a part of that team.

In addition to this, for a long time, as a Person of Color, I have been deeply passionate about God's heart for justice and unity and have prayed that the Lord would create a way for that passion to intersect with my role in ministry. Last summer, God led our church into establishing a small team, including myself, to focus on racial unity and to keep that aim in front of us. That led to us creating space to intentionally listen to the experiences and hurts of People of Color in our church. It also resulted in us offering a church class called Conversations about Race.

In the class, we trained and challenged members in having Gospel-centered, often uncomfortable conversations related to race that reflect the heart of Jesus and His ministry of reconciliation. Having these conversations in our church has been challenging, refining, and is leading to great healing and restoration! **These are just a couple of examples of how we have seen God making "springs in the desert".**
